

Background


- China and India source of much wealth
- Trade between Europe and Asia controlled by Muslims
 - Rivalry between Christians and Muslims intensified when Muslims conquered Constantinople 1453
 - Finding a way to get around Muslim middlemen would mean more profits for Christians

Afro-Eurasian Trade Routes



Background cont.

- Reformation leads to increased motivation by Catholics to expand the Church
- Renaissance leads to improved technology, increased interest in the unknown
- Demand for gold and silver increases for trade with Asia



European Exploration


- Spain and Portugal attempt to find ways to India and China that will bypass Muslim middlemen
 - Portuguese Prince Henry the Navigator (early 1400's) sends explorers along African coast to find route to India
 - Find gold, slaves in Africa
 - Bartolomieu Dias makes it around Africa 1488
 - Vasco de Gama makes it to India 1497
